Catherine Coquery-Vodrovitch is Professor Emeritus of Modern African History in University Paris-7-Denis-Diderot and Adjunct Professor of Sociology at Binghamton University, State University of New York since 1981. She trained in Paris and in African universities with a large number of French-speaking African historians, and published half a dozen books, among which two were translated into English—*Africa South of the Sahara, Endurance and Change* (University of California Press, 1987) and *African Women: A Modern History* (Westview Press, 1998). A third book in English entitled *African Urbanization from the Beginnings to Colonialism*, (Markus Wiener, Princeton) is forthcoming in 2005. Coquery-Vidrovitch edited about twenty books on African studies and the Third World. In 1999, she was awarded the Distinguished Africanist Award at the annual convention of the African Studies Association in Philadelphia. Since August 2000, she has been the French member of the ICHS/CISH (International Conference of Historical Sciences) International Bureau.
